

When you can and should call the emergency number 112

112



Someone is seriously injured or ill



You see fire or smoke



Someone is hurting or harming another person, or damaging their property

Install the 112 Suomi app on your child's phone. For more information on the correct use of the emergency number, see www.112.fi/en.116.000 – the EU-wide helpline for missing children.



Be aware of dangerous situations and stay safe. The safety instructions are there to protect you.



Avoid and stay away from the following situations, leave the place or online conversation immediately, and never agree to any requests from a stranger or someone you met online. Always inform your teachers or parents straight away!



If a stranger asks you to get into a car or go with them
– **do not go!**

On your way to school, if a stranger asks for help and wants you to go with them – **do not go!**

If a stranger offers you sweets, other treats, or drinks
– **do not accept them!**



If you are lost and cannot find your way home
– **call 112**

If you see someone hurting another person and there are no adults nearby
– **call 112**

If you see a dangerous object at school (such as a knife)
– **call 112**



Never send pictures or personal information to strangers, even if they ask.

Never take part in dangerous social media challenges, even if someone tells you to or others are doing them.

Do not trust everyone online – someone may pretend to be someone they are not.



If someone touches you in your private areas, tell a trusted adult immediately.

You can and should always talk to a trusted adult if something scares, surprises, or worries you.

In an emergency, call 112! You can also call the Child and Youth Helpline at 116111, where someone will listen and support you.
